## **APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

## **BOARD RENEWALS & NEW APPOINTMENTS**

Joan O'Fallon reported that term renewals were approved by the Polk-Burnett Electric Cooperative board at its June 26 regular board meeting for Gary Ganje, District 3; Marlyn Bottolfson, District 4 and JoAnn Kipping, District 7. New terms run 2023 – 2026.

O'Fallon also reported that a new director will be appointed by the electric co-op board in District 1 to fill the position held by Clarice Johnson for 20 years (2003-2023). Johnson resigned, effective July 1, because she is moving out of Polk-Burnett's service territory. We appreciate her dedication and service!

A motion was made by Elvira Schmidt and seconded by JoAnn Kipping to nominate **Alma Karels for secretary-treasurer**. Nominations closed. Unanimous approval.

## **DELEGATE AUTHORITY TO ADMINISTER SECRETARY/TREASURER DUTIES**

A motion was made by Gary Ganje and seconded by Elvira Schmidt to delegate day-to-day administrative duties of the secretary/treasurer to Polk-Burnett's communications director and manager of finance and accounting. Motion approved.

#### ANNUAL POLICY AND BYLAW REVIEW

The board reviewed policies and bylaws. No changes.

#### APPROVAL OF APRIL MINUTES

#### APPROVAL OF TREASURER'S REPORT

A motion was made by Gary Ganje and seconded by Herschel Brown to approve the treasurer's report. Motion approved. Year-to-date funds through June 2023 totaled \$72,318.77. Year-to-date grants totaled \$40,804, and \$479.46 was paid out for mileage reimbursement. The ending balance is \$31,035.31.
