## This is why a clear right-of-way is important

We all love trees for their beauty, shade and habitat, but this picture, *top right*, is a reminder that trees can cause outages and safety hazards when they're too close to power lines. This was taken during an ice storm last March, when a tree fell on the power line south of Trollhaugen. It caused an outage for 282 co-op members. Lineman couldn't access the area with a bucket truck, so they hiked in with a chainsaw to repair damage and restore power.

Our right-of-way clearing program is an investment that keeps trees away from power lines to help prevent forest fires and power outages, and keep everyone safe.

### It's good to see co-op workers on your property

In addition to right-of-way clearing, Polk-Burnett employees and contractors also work throughout our service territory inspecting equipment. *At bottom right*, inspectors are testing power poles for damage. Poles that are not up to standards are replaced to ensure reliable electricity for co-op members. *Polk-Burnett maintains 38,000 power poles across our system!*

It's good to see co-op workers in the rights-of-way and easements, and across your private property and driveways. Our efforts to ensure reliable power for you and your neighbors mean we must cross your property from time to time. You may see us:

- ✓ Making routine repairs
- ✓ Replacing meters
- ✓ Trimming trees and brush
- ✓ Locating buried utilities for construction and digging projects
- ✓ Working to upgrade poles, wires, transformers and equipment
- ✓ Inspecting power poles, lines, transformer boxes and equipment

All field work, except emergency power restoration, is conducted during normal working hours, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Every effort is made to avoid damage and unnecessary intrusion. If you have concerns about our work, contact us at 800-421-0283. We appreciate your cooperation.



## Do the Summer Shift and Beat the Peak to cut cost and carbon



Do you know that Polk-Burnett does not own power plants? We buy electricity and distribute it to you, our 21,000+ co-op members. We're working to keep our wholesale cost of power from rising, and you can help:

**Do the Summer Shift:** Shift your electricity use away from the hours when regional grid demand and cost are highest. Reduce electricity 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays this summer.

**Enroll in Beat the Peak:** We'll send you a peak alert by text, email or phone asking you to reduce electricity when demand and cost are high. Participants receive about nine summer peak alerts and three winter peak alerts. Enroll on [polkburnett.com](http://polkburnett.com) or 800-421-0283.

**Together we save:** When you reduce electricity during peak times:

- ☀ You reduce the wholesale cost of electricity, which helps hold rates down.
- ☀ You reduce the need for power generation, which cuts carbon and is good for the environment.

Most manufacturers recommend an annual tune up for your home cooling system.



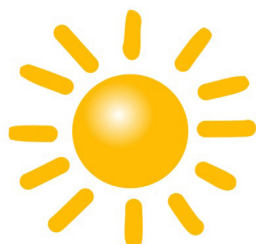
## A/C notice for members in load management

Power to air conditioners controlled by the co-op's load management program will be cycled every 15 minutes during peak demand hours, from 2 to 6 p.m. or 6 to 10:30 p.m.

This reduces the co-op's cost for peak-demand power, which benefits all members.

Historically, control periods are on the hottest days of the summer; however, they are based on electricity demand throughout the entire Midwest region and may occur when local weather conditions are not extreme.

*Energy Saver: Regularly replacing your AC filter helps maintain the system and saves energy.*



## Summer rate in effect June to September

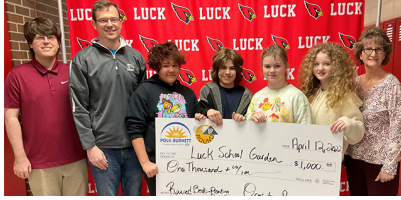
Your summer rate is 11.6¢ per kWh, for invoice dates June to September.

Your winter rate is 10.1¢ per kWh, for invoice dates October to May.

**Rates reflect actual cost of power:** Polk-Burnett pays a higher summer rate for wholesale power because members use more electricity during the hot days of summer, making demand and costs rise.

# Operation Round Up helps teach kids about gardening
