

Rate increase begins in July, as inflation drives up costs The cooperative will implement a 3% electric rate increase in July 2025 to cover the rising cost of building and

The cooperative will implement a 3% electric rate increase in July 2025 to cover the rising cost of building and maintaining the electric system. For residential, seasonal and small commercial members, bills will go up about \$3 for every \$100 spent, or \$55 annually for an average bill of 1,000 kWh. Large commercial members will see an increase of 4.7%.

"Rate increases are never easy, but this is necessary to continue our investment in the electric grid and provide you with reliable electricity," said Board President Ed Gullickson.

Inflation is driving up the cost of the materials and equipment we use, especially wire, trucks, transformers and things made with metals (copper, aluminum, steel). Since 2020, the price for utility construction materials has risen 51%. Contractor services for right-of-way clearing, underground cable installation and underground utility locating have also escalated.

The last rate increase was in March 2023. Current and new rates, effective July 1, are shown in the table below.

As a cooperative, Polk-Burnett will continue to give money back to members through EnergySense rebates and Capital Credits. We're also here to assist you at local offices with local employees.

Your bill is affected by the new rate, but also by weather and your energy use.

Co-op awards 101 scholarships to Class of 2025, most ever!



Polk-Burnett Electric Cooperative will present its largest number of scholarships to the Class of 2025, with 101 sons and daughters of co-op members each receiving \$1,500 to continue education after high school. A total of \$151,500 will be awarded by the co-op.

"We are pleased to invest in the next generation of co-op members through our high school scholarship program," said General Manager Steve Stroshane.

"Giving back to our local community and youth is part of our mission as a co-op," added Communications Director Joan O'Fallon. "We had an outstanding group of

candidates this year! Thank you for your community service and congratulations to all 2025 graduates."

Polk-Burnett scholarship winners demonstrate a cooperative spirit through community service and make a difference in the lives of others. Winners were notified in February, and many will be recognized in person by co-op employees and board directors during local school award nights this spring.

Since 1987, Polk-Burnett has given more than \$1 million in scholarships to help students pursue advanced education. Scholarships do not affect electricity rates for members; they are funded with unclaimed Capital Credits that would be forfeited to the state if not used for education, and by the generosity of co-op members who donate their Capital Credits. Board election ballots mailed to members in districts 4, 5 and 6



Polk-Burnett Electric Cooperative will hold an election this spring for board directors serving co-op districts 4, 5 and 6. Ballots were mailed April 28 to members in those districts with instructions to vote by mail or online.

As a co-op, Polk-Burnett is owned by members and governed by a board of directors elected from its membership. Board directors serve a three-year term and attend monthly meetings to guide policy and budget decisions.

District 4 includes the towns of Balsam Lake, Apple River, Beaver, Clayton and Almena. Candidates on the ballot in District 4 are incumbent director Joe Metro of Balsam Lake and Adam Majeske of Balsam Lake.

District 5 includes the towns of McKinley, Maple Plain, Georgetown, Johnstown and Crystal Lake. Incumbent director John Ukura of Luck is running unopposed.

District 6 includes the towns of LaFollette, Dewey, West Sweden, Lorain, Roosevelt, Luck, Clam Falls and Bone Lake. Incumbent director Wilfred Owens of Frederic is running unopposed.

"Electric cooperatives are unique because we are owned and governed by the members we serve," said General Manager Steve Stroshane. "Co-op directors are local members who live and work here; they understand and listen to our community. Local board governance is one of the greatest advantages of our co-op business model."
