

# Co-op enhances community safety with \$694,880 zero-interest loan for new Alden Fire Station

Construction of a new fire station means that safety and peace of mind will be a lot closer to home for families in the Town of Alden. Helping to finance the new station is a \$694,880 zero-interest pass-through loan from Polk-Burnett Electric Cooperative, via the U.S.

Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant (REDLG) program.

The new station will improve fire, rescue and first-response service for local residents and is part of Allied Emergency Services, a newly formed fire district serving the towns of Osceola, Alden, Garfield and the Village of Dresser.

"Many of these rural families are co-op members, and we are proud to be a part of this project that looks out for their long-term needs and improves our



local quality of life," said Polk-Burnett Board President Ed Gullickson. "The zero-interest loan from Polk-Burnett provides \$350,000 in interest savings for fire district taxpayers and allows us to support our communities far beyond our electric service. We are excited to receive USDA funding for this project; this is an opportunity to make a difference in our community."

As a cooperative, Polk-Burnett is eligible for USDA loans to support rural economic development; our participation does not impact electric rates for members.

### **Building redundancies into the electric grid**

**LESS THAN ONE HOUR WITHOUT POWER PER MEMBER PER YEAR!** That's the target we work toward, and that's the result that puts Polk-Burnett in the top 25% nationwide for reliability. To achieve our reliability goal, we invested \$3.5 million in 2018 to upgrade and maintain 3,000+ miles of power line.

**Re-routing your power:** A significant investment this year has been building redundancies into the electric grid, so if power goes out at the substation or section of line serving your home or business, we can re-route power to you from a different substation. This decreases the duration of the power outage while linemen make repairs. To date, we have added equipment and switches to re-route power at the Luck and Bunyan substations to decrease the duration of power outages for members.

**Short blinks prevent long outages:** Pictured above, co-op linemen installed new reclosers at Bunyan Substation east of Balsam Lake as part of our 2018 work plan. Reclosers are circuit breakers that sense and interrupt faults on power lines. The equipment automatically closes a circuit that's been opened by a fault on the lines, and members may see up to three short blinks. If the fault is temporary, power is automatically restored. (Temporary faults are often caused by wildlife, small branches or lightning.) If the fault is permanent, power shuts down and linemen will be dispatched to repair the damage.

Reclosers and blinks help reduce lengthy power outages, and protect wires and equipment from damage. Polk-Burnett has 500 reclosers throughout the system.
