Reliable Power: Our first priority is always to provide you with reliable, safe electricity. You can count on us to deliver power for heating, cooking, hot water, charging electronics, keeping your lights on and so much more. We know you rely on electricity for your well-being and quality of life.

We can help with account changes and payment arrangements; we can hook up your new meter or security light, and we've got a great deal on water heaters (see back). Co-op Member Benefits: SmartHub account access, EnergySense rebates and Capital Credits are direct benefits of your co-op membership. We've helped members improve comfort and energy efficiency in your homes by providing EnergySense rebates since 2008. And since our beginning, we've distributed Capital Credits to members, based on the amount of electricity you buy. Last year, we returned more than \$1 million!

Community Support: Co-ops support our community beyond electric service. We give back through Operation Round Up, our scholarship program and economic development loans. Co-op employees also volunteer to make our hometowns better.

Polk-Burnett was founded 81 years ago in 1938 to fulfill a vital need in our community that wasn't being met by other utilities. Concerned local leaders came together to build our co-op and bring electricity to areas where there was none. Most of you don't remember when the lights came on in rural homes and farms, and over time, folks have come to think of us as just another energy provider. But we are not. Co-op electricity is becoming greener

In our 2018 member survey, many of you said that renewable energy is important to you, and that it should be a priority for the co-op. Polk-Burnett and our wholesale power provider, Dairyland Power Cooperative, are diversifying generation resources and increasing solar and wind energy.

Today, about 18% of the energy that flows into our distribution system from Dairyland Power Cooperative is from renewable sources.

Nationwide, renewables make up about 10% of the power mix, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Our new SunTuria Solar array in Centuria is one of 18 solar facilities developed by Dairyland Power Cooperative, and it's the first utility-scale solar in our service territory. We are proud to provide you with clean, renewable energy to power your homes and devices. See our solar energy tracker on polkburnett.com

Co-op security light brightens from dusk to dawn Polk-Burnett offers energy-efficient LED security lights for co-op members. Security lights are installed on

Polk-Burnett poles and operate from dusk to dawn. Members are charged a monthly maintenance fee for the light, and installation fees may apply.

All co-op security lights use LEDs, which save about 70% in energy costs and \$50,000 per year in repair and replacement costs.

Safety tip: Use space heaters with caution

Space heaters are a leading cause of house fires. Keep your home and family safe:

- Y Make sure space heater has an auto shutoff if it tips over.
- Plug space heater directly into an outlet, never an extension cord.
- Space heaters should be cool to the touch when in use.
- Place space heater on a level, non-flammable surface, away from rugs, curtains and furniture.
- Never leave a space heater unattended when in use. Unplug when leaving the room or going to bed. Don't be misled by expensive models that claim to lower heating bills. Electric heaters cost from \$30 to

\$300, but no matter what the price, all 1,500-watt electric heaters use the same amount of electricity to operate and deliver the same heat output. Be safe and stay clear of marketing hype. Get the facts about electric space heaters from the energy experts at Polk-Burnett, 800-421-0283, ext. 595.
